FROM THE CHAIRMAN

ANDREW JENKINS

We were part of a group selling Mey Selection beef and we stayed up in the castle where we were all introduced to him (a party of around 20).

I must say he was very interested in what we were doing and his grandmother, the Queen Mother, allowed us to market the beef under a brand of 'Mey Selections' named after her home at the Castle of Mey.

Her Majesty, Queen Elizabeth II

(1926 – 2022)



Good afternoon and welcome to today's game against Wimbledon. I also welcome Johnnie, his staff and players to Brunton Park for what I am sure will be another keenly contested fixture.

Wimbledon have been on a tricky run recently, and I know Johnnie will be looking for more of the type of performance from what is a very talented squad that he got down at Crawley as they look to settle into life in League Two in the important months ahead.

By all accounts they caused Northampton problems on Tuesday night, and I'm sure they'll be looking to bounce back from the disappointment of that result in this game.

We spoke after our last home game against Rochdale about the importance of making this a difficult place to come. As we've said before, teams that go on to achieve something tend to have strong home records, and we want to reward the support we've been getting with good performances that give everyone plenty to smile about.

That's never a given, and we are constantly reminding the players that they have to do the basics and produce the minimum requirements of maximum effort and commitment that our fans expect from every game, home or away.

Tuesday night at Mansfield was an example of that. Defensively we were solid, which deservedly earned a clean sheet, and we created some excellent chances that could easily have turned it into three points.

Being disappointed at having drawn against one of the division's fancied teams is a sign of the standards and expectations we're putting on ourselves, and we must continue to strive to turn what we're doing into wins by being ruthless and clinical when we need to be, and by maintaining the same levels

of performance consistently. That has to be our aim.

Last weekend, of course, the country was at the beginning of a period of mourning for Her Majesty, Queen Elizabeth II. That meant

that the fixture list was suspended as we all paid our respects for a lifetime of faultless service, and I think we all understood why that decision was made.

We will remember her again ahead of kick-off this afternoon, as clubs up and down the country once again come together ahead of Monday's funeral. I was lucky enough to meet Her Majesty when I was at Derby, with my oldest son Joe presenting her with replica shirts for the young princes ahead of the official opening of Pride Park, and I know that many people have their own recollections and stories to tell.

On Tuesday we will also say goodbye to Tony Bingley, a dear friend and colleague who worked with us for many years at the club. He made such a huge difference in so many areas, but he'll be missed most by us all for the way he was with everybody. He was such a bright, positive character and someone you genuinely looked forward to talking to. It goes without saying that our thoughts are with his family and loved ones at this time.

Enjoy the game.

Carlisle made it three draws from four league games courtesy of a seventh of the season from Jabo Ibehre as they took their time to get going in what became a frustrating game.

The Cumbrians thought they'd scored on 10 minutes when another fizzed Grainger corner invited Kennedy to jump. He connected well and Shea was relieved to see it smash back off the upright as he remained rooted to the spot.

Wimbledon bit back with a good spell of their own and a cross into the box found Elliott in space. He connected well but Gillespie dived across to beat it away. Grainger was alert and he completed the clearance before Taylor could get a touch.

A long ball forward sent Wimbledon on the attack on 36 minutes and a touch from Taylor put Francomb through on the right. The wide man moved into space and he had options as he ghosted into the box. Barcham shouted for it and he made no mistake as he carefully picked his spot.

Carlisle were almost undone again just after the break when Francomb charged a Grainger clearance down. The rebound left the Dons man in space and Gillespie had to show firm hands to parry it away.

Wimbledon should have doubled their lead on 55 minutes when Elliott dropped a shoulder and poked the ball between Raynes and Archibald-Henville.

It opened up in front of him but he got his bearings wrong and sent a poor shot well past the target.

A weak header from Elliott was easy for Gillespie to claim as the visitors kept going forward, and a miscued volley from Ibehre from a Wyke nod down marked another slow period of the game as the Dons made it difficult for Carlisle to find space.

Carlisle kept their heads up and they were back on terms on 67 minutes when a deep free kick was nodded down inside the area. **Jabo Ibehre** → took a touch and he made it seven for the season with another unstoppable finish.



Grainger twice went close with raking shots as spirits rose around Brunton Park and Kennedy was even closer when he ran into the box for a Brough delivery. Miller picked it up at the back post and his outswinger brought an overhead kick from the acrobatic midfielder which Shea had to save.

Both sides cancelled each other out through the closing stages, and Akinfenwa blazed another shot over in time added on, as the share of the points became the fair result when the final whistle blew.

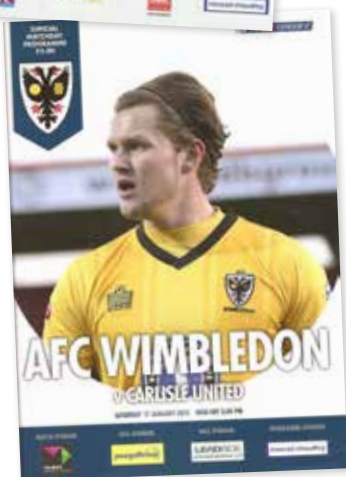
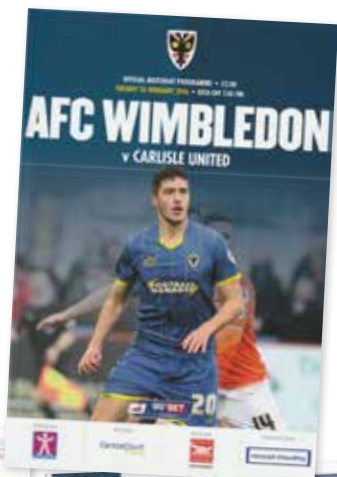

Good afternoon, and welcome to today's match against AFC Wimbledon.

Carlisle United Community Sports Trust (CUFC CST) have been working within local primary schools to deliver the 'Premier League Primary Stars' (PLPS) program since 2016. P.L Primary Stars uses the appeal of the Premier League and professional football clubs to inspire children to learn, be active and develop important life skills. Available to every primary school in England and Wales, it inspires girls and boys aged 5-11 in the classroom, the playground and on the sports field. Learning is connected to the real world of sport to enthuse pupils when tackling challenging PSHE topics such as resilience, diversity, self-esteem, and nutrition. Our vision is to inspire and create healthier and more positive futures for the children of Cumbria.

The P.L Primary Stars program consists of:

- Teacher CPD and mentoring programme for the delivery of high-quality physical education.
- Classroom sessions covering PSHE (Physical, Social, Health and Education).
- Maths and English intervention sessions.
- Health and well-being assemblies.
- The integration of literacy and numeracy within sports
- Mass participation events and tournaments for pupils, teachers and schools to attend.

The focus is on developing the whole child – improving their physical literacy, enhancing their learning, and teaching them relevant skills and behaviours that they can carry with them into later life.

A typical PLPS day within a school would start with the delivery of P.E session, which also involves working with the teacher to develop their PE delivery skills. The class would then go inside ready for a PSHE classroom lesson which tackles life skills

such as resilience, teamwork, nutrition, and positive behaviour. CUFC CST coaches would then work with targeted groups focusing on numeracy, literacy or reading. The program also then hosts lunch time sports clubs to targeted groups and individuals.

PLPS values underpin everything we deliver, encouraging children to:

- **Be ambitious** – work hard and never give up on their goals
- **Be inspiring** – set a great example to others
- **Be connected** – work well with others and in a team
- **Be fair** – treat people equally and think of others



The PLPS programme has been a real success for the Community Sports Trust. This academic year we have impacted over 2000 participants in more than 250 sessions.... and we're looking forward to continuing the relationship with our county's schools this coming year.

We hope you enjoy today's game.

Both of AFC Wimbledon's previous trips to Carlisle in the Football League have finished as draws (4-4 in 2014-15 and 1-1 in 2015-16).



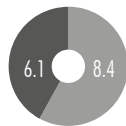

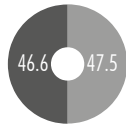

There was some really sad news for Carlisle United Football Club last week when we were informed that our dear friend Tony Bingley had passed away.

Tony, 82, was a huge supporter of the club and worked part-time, full-time and in a voluntary capacity in a number of roles for close to 40 years for the Blues.

A proud Yorkshireman he became an adopted Cumbrian on his move to Carlisle, and an invaluable member of the backroom team at Brunton Park, first forging sponsorship and partnership links with businesses across the county before joining the 1921 board as commercial director.

Chairman Andrew Jenkins said: "This is such a sad loss, we are all devastated at the club, because Tony was first and foremost a friend to everyone.

"He would go out of his way to help and offer advice, even after he had retired. People may not know that he gave up two or three mornings a week to pop in and look after things like vehicle servicing and documentation schedules, and to help with bits and pieces in our commercial department until just a few years ago.

"He was an infectious character because of his bright and positive attitude, and the way he dealt with people opened doors. The role of commercial director was a perfect fit for him and he was a huge part of driving the club forward in that area.

"Away from the club his passion was motorbikes, and he would travel far and wide to watch and help with some of the biggest races on the circuit. In his younger days he was a racer, and some of the stories he had were fascinating to listen to.

"We will miss him. He loved the club, he was part of



Carlisle United for so many years, and it will be very strange not to hear his voice in the boardroom and to see him cheering the lads on during games.

"Our thoughts are with his family and loved ones at this very sad time."

Chief executive Nigel Clibbens said: "Tony always brightened your

day whenever he was around. He was a pleasure to be with and get to know.

"We spent many hours together talking about bike racing and his exploits. It was fascinating hearing him talk about 100mph laps at the TT in the 1990's.

"The impact of his massive racing accident at Oliver's Mount affected him physically but it never slowed him down. He continued to volunteer to help within the club even as his mobility reduced in recent years. He will be very sadly missed by us all."



Manager Paul Simpson said: "It's hard to put into words how much of a sad loss this is for us at the club and, of course, for his family and friends.

"He had such an enthusiastic approach to everything he did, and that came across in the work he did here at Brunton Park.

"I had many conversations with him about his racing history and, as you might imagine with a sport like that, his stories were fascinating to listen to.

"He was brilliant in the role he played for the club because he was a person who liked to get results. He did that with a smile on his face and with a kind word, and that's why he tended to get successful outcomes.

"People wanted to help him not because of who he was, or who he worked for, but because of how he was with them.

"Since coming back to the club in February I've mentioned to quite a few people that he's been a big miss for me. He used to be somebody I could go to through my first spell here, but unfortunately he hasn't been well enough to come in.

"He'll be sorely missed and my thoughts are with his loved ones."

Rest in Peace Tony, love from us all.

Only 64 days to go to the 2022 World Cup so as 1986 and 2002 were significant years in Wimbledon football history, I'll trawl my memories of those two finals.

England's poor start in Mexico 1986, losing 1-0 to Portugal and drawing 0-0 with Morocco, was redeemed by Gary Lineker's hat-trick to beat Poland 3-0. Two more Lineker goals and one from Peter Beardsley sealed England's next 3-0 win against Paraguay.

Diego Maradona's 'Hand of God' goal and brilliant solo effort in Argentina's 2-1 Quarter Final, will be remembered long after we've all forgotten that Argentina beat West Germany 3-2 in the Final or that Lineker's goal v Argentina made him the tournament's top marksman. Scotland performed not badly against Denmark (0-1) and West Germany (1-2) in the so called 'Group of Death' but failed to score against ten-man Uruguay.

FIFA chose Asia for the 2002 Finals, hosted by Japan and South Korea. Senegal shocked holders France 1-0 in the opening game, South Korea and Turkey made it through to the semis and Brazil eventually lifted the trophy, thanks to two goals from Ronaldo. England limped through to the last eight but lost 2-1 to Brazil as the luckless David Seaman was beaten by Ronaldinho's swerving 40-yard free kick.

The original Wimbledon was a proud and powerful amateur club, although not so powerful when I saw them lose in 1954 to my local Kent League team Sheppey United in the FA Amateur Cup.



Turning professional in 1964 they joined the Southern League and won election to the Football League in 1977 at the expense of Workington.

A couple of promotions saw them join us in the Second Division by 1984 and third place in 1986 took them up to the First Division. The happy go lucky lifestyle of the 'Dons' squad earned them the nickname of 'Crazy Gang' which added more glamour to their famous 1988 FA Cup Final win against Liverpool.

I added **Plough Lane** to my ground-hopping collection when I saw them against Arsenal and had an unexpected chance to see them in Scotland in 1997 when Aberdeen's Brian Irvine had a Dons v Dons game for his Testimonial.

AFC Wimbledon was started by supporters in 2002 when Wimbledon FC was hijacked and carted off to Milton Keynes. Within nine years the AFC had risen through all five lower tiers and won the Blue Square Play-off against Luton on penalties to join the EFL. Their progress was kept in the public eye by supporter Alun Armstrong wearing the colours in his role in the long running TV series 'New Tricks'.

Meanwhile I had intended to complete my set of London area grounds with Dagenham and Redbridge v Carlisle on April 30 but changed my mind to avoid what was, with a Royal wedding, probably the capital's busiest weekend ever. I opted instead for the next game at their Victoria Road Stadium which was AFC Wimbledon's first away EFL match.

They met Carlisle for a couple of seasons from 2014 and now return to League Two after last season's relegation.
