Good afternoon and welcome to our opening game of the season against Crawley Town. It'll be good to see Kevin Betsy and Dan Micciche again and I wish them well at their new club. I know they will be setting high standards and, like us, they'll want their campaign to get off to a good start.

This afternoon is, of course, what the work done through the summer has been leading towards but, along with the anticipation and excitement that the opening day brings, we also have to remind ourselves that it's the first of 46 league games, and our focus has to be on consistency throughout what is always a long and tough nine-month season.

That's why the pre-season programme was structured in the way that it was, to make sure that we reached good levels, heading towards a peak but with an acknowledgement that we can still push further, as we will need to do, as the weeks and months go by.

Credit to all the staff on the football side for their work behind the scenes in helping to put together a programme that has ensured we have stretched and tested the players in their training sessions, and during the friendly fixtures we have played.

And we must say thank you to all the staff working in other parts of the organisation to get the club ready for today. Their hard work often gets little recognition, although without them we couldn't make this happen.

The players also deserve credit for the way they have taken the messages and demands on board and we head into today, which is followed by a very busy August, with a sense that the group is in a good place.



We've talked a lot about shared and individual responsibility and, with the discipline and structure we've seen within the shape that we're adopting on the pitch, we're seeing good signs of an understanding



of what it means to work together, and the benefits that approach brings.

As I've said before, this is by no means the finished product, there is still a lot for us to do, but it's encouraging that we're starting to get a sense of an identity that people can buy into and support.

There will be bumps along the road as we go on from here and we have obvious challenges to face. The key thing for me is that we do that together. We know that part of the responsibility we shoulder is to produce performances that will get bums on seats, so that the potential we all know is here at this club is realised.

There are no guarantees in terms of outcomes, but one thing we can guarantee is that every player will give everything they have every time they cross that line. That's non-negotiable. And with that we know you'll be behind us every step of the way.

The Red Devils hit the woodwork on nine minutes when a training ground corner routine somehow made its way to Tilley. Francomb had completely sliced the initial 20-yarder, but that allowed Tsaroulla to bring the midfielder into play. A fierce effort from distance curled onto the post and the rebound was swept away to safety.

Crawley were gifted a goal on 25 minutes when Feeney miscontrolled on the edge of the area, with the ball stuck under his feet. Nadesan was on it in a flash and he left Howard with no chance as he smashed it into the bottom corner.

United looked to bite back and Dickenson robbed possession in his own half to set another attack in motion. Gibson received it, and he spun on the spot to find Mellish. Dickenson arrived on the edge of the box but he was under pressure and he dragged his snapshot wide.

A thunderbolt from Brennan Dickenson at the start of the second half brought a roar from the crowd. He took a touch, 28-yards from the target, and put his laces through a screamer of an attempt. Morris was beaten and relieved to see it strike the top of the crossbar.

Dickenson brought another save out of Morris on the hour when he sat deep to take over from Patrick.

It was low, and arrowed, but the stopper parried and the rebound skipped just past Gibson, who was looking to snaffle up the loose pieces.

There was potential disaster on 73 minutes when a powerful shot from Tilley was parried by Howard. He hesitated as he expected Armer to clear, and Tilley skipped in to try to nick it. An outstretched leg from the left back caught the heel, sending him to the ground, and a spot kick was awarded. Nadesan placed it, and he was left with his head in his hands as he crunched it high and wide.

Abrahams and Alessandra came on late in the day as the hosts looked to take something, and it looked like

it had paid off when Alessandra timed a great run to meet a flicked through ball from Dickenson. He chested it down and had just Morris to beat, but the keeper spread himself to make a vital block at close range.

CRAIG FARRELL

Craig was with the Blues for just under three years scoring 24 goals in 95 appearances, which included a fine introduction to Brunton Park with a goal on his debut against Torguay having initially joined the club for a one-month loan spell from Leeds.

A total of four goals that month prompted discussions about a permanent move, and that was all finalised in November 2002 when he penned a three-year deal for an undisclosed fee.

That first season was his best with the club, with 14 goals netted in 41 appearances, but a run of five goals in seven outings through March and April 2004 was part of a revival under manager Paul Simpson which almost saved the club from the drop into the Conference, and it was a peak in form which confirmed him as a favourite with many of the fans.



Exeter, York, Oxford, Rushden and Telford

when he moved on from Cumbria and latterly had spells with Hinckley United, Blyth Spartans and Whitby Town.

FRANK CLARKE

Frank, one of five footballing brothers, was a top transfer target for manager Alan Ashman, who had

seen the team struggle in Division Two through the 1972/73 season.

A formidable, strong forward, he had an immediate impact as he netted on his debut in a 1-1 home draw with Cardiff.



He led the line with aplomb as United defied the odds to clinch promotion to Division One, with 16 of the goals coming from the bustling target man along the way.

His finest hour in a Carlisle shirt came at the end of

CLIVE MIDDLEMASS



Sheffield-born Clive started in the game at Leeds, then moved to Workington, where he played over 170 games.

> He worked as scout, chief scout and assistant manager at a number of clubs after he'd retired from playing, including

Bristol Rovers and Bristol City, Burnley, Preston, Derby and Everton.

March 1974 when he scored four (one from the spot) in a 5-1 home win over relegation doomed Swindon Town.

It was fitting that he bagged the last goal of that season when United took the points from Aston Villa here at Brunton Park in front of 12,494 expectant fans, setting up a nail-biting finale with everyone in Cumbria camped in front of their radios for the Orient game that followed, on the night that promotion was confirmed

Frank scored over 30 goals in just over 150 appearances for the Blues between 1973 and 1978, and also represented Shrewsbury Town, Ipswich Town and QPR over a career that spanned 17 years in the sixties and seventies.

One of his only stints as manager was here at Brunton Park between 1987 and 1991, having taken over a struggling outfit from Harry Gregg. He steadied the ship and flirted with the play-offs at the end of the 1989/90 campaign, missing out on the final day due to an away defeat at Maidstone.

A popular manager with the players, he parted ways with the Blues in March 1991 as his team struggled to make a dint in Division Four.

Kevin Betsv have been busy on and off the park. New signings include Dom Telford → who last season was the top League Two scorer with 26 goals for Newport County.

The backroom staff now includes a video analyst, a strength and



conditioning coach and an in-house medical team. Fans in their area have usually supported Crystal Palace or Brighton but may well be tempted to take advantage of a 30% reduction in season ticket prices and follow their local team.

Former ESPN analyst Johnson was a founder member of 'Wagmi United', a huge consortium of mainly American entrepreneurs who now have ambitious plans to take Crawley up to the Premier League.

Presumably the marketing strategy is that by making it exclusive it will become a valuable collectible.






