FROM THE MANAGER

Good afternoon and welcome to today's game against Crewe. I also welcome Alex, his staff and players to Brunton Park for what we expect will be another good game.

Currently in mid-table, Crewe have been very hard to beat this season, and I'm sure that will be the same again today. Like us, they'll feel they could possibly have more points on the board, based on performances, and I'm sure they'll be looking to bounce back quickly from the disappointment of last weekend's result at home.

We had to work hard to get the points in our last game here, against Wimbledon, and the pleasing aspect was that we showed a number of different sides to our game. You rarely get everything your own way at this level, and that's when it's important to stick together and back each other up as much as possible, as we saw again at Grimsby on Tuesday night.

As we've said a number of times, we've had an OK start. We want to build on it, and we thank you for your efforts in helping us with that. Let's hope for another good performance and result today.

Enjoy the game.



Crewe looked to stay tight through the opening minutes but an exchange of passes between Nadesan and Hope on the edge of the box created the slightest of gaps which the Blues looked to exploit. Hope tried to clip a shot to the far corner but it was just too high and it dipped over the bar.

Direct forward play from Hope brought a corner as he skipped past two challenges, and the ball pinged around the box from the resulting Devitt cross until Hunt stepped in to hook it clear.

The play stayed mostly in midfield as Carlisle tried to find a way through, with Crewe sitting deep, and Devitt tested Garratt from 30-yards when he called for a pass from Hope. It skipped off the surface and the stopper showed good hands.

There was a let-off for the home side midway through the half when Ng was left unmarked as a corner delivery bent into the area. He had the width of the target to aim at but he got his bearings wrong and his header went well wide.

One-touch passing from Grainger and Etuhu worked space for Devitt to go for it with a firm connection as both sides kept chipping away, but his shot was too close to Garratt and he dropped comfortably to make the save.

A heavy fall for Grainger saw him leave the field of play on the half hour, to be replaced by Macaulay Gillesphey, but United recovered from the blow to play some good football as they tried to pick up the pace. Yates angled a run to pull away from his man and he picked out Devitt in a crowd of players. Hope shouted but his first-time punt was right at the keeper.

There was more bad news for United on 51 minutes when Fryer raced off his line to intercept a through ball from Miller. He collided with Green and had to leave the pitch on a stretcher as his teammates and medical staff showed a huge amount of concern. Paul Green went the same way as he also failed to recover.

Both sides started brightly after the delay and Nadesan was about to pull the trigger on a ball over the top when Raynes slid in to make a timely challenge. Crewe broke and Gerrard was excellent as he stretched to hook clear when Bowery tried to find Miller

It was pace from Ashley Nadesan which put the home side in front when he shrugged off his man to get on to a flick from Bennett as he won the battle for a high ball forward. Nadesan then showed strength and poise to set himself, draw the keeper and find the bottom corner to register his first ever goal at Brunton Park, and his fifth in total for the club.

Chris Porter's first touch late in the game was to thunder a 12-yard header over the bar, but United should have put the game out of sight as Devitt lofted a beauty of a pass into Hope's path. The keeper was off his line but Hope went for power and slashed it high into the sky.



16-18 TRAINEESHIP PROGRAMME

Working in partnership with the EFL Trust, CUFC CST have ran several 12- week Traineeship

The programmes are designed to give all 16–18-year-old NEET young people the opportunity to learn new skills and enhance their ability to find employment.

It offers students the chance to gain work experience in various working environments; in sectors they hope to gain employment/experience in whilst also improving on their English and Maths skills. Students also take part in employability training to prepare them for work including CV writing, job search and application and interview skills etc.

Regular guest speakers are also in attendance providing the students with opportunities to enhance their knowledge on such things as:

- Money Management
- Drug & Alcohol Awareness
- Sexual Health Awareness
- First Aid/Road safety

We have had some successful outcomes for students on completion of the programmes, gaining employment and apprenticeships in various sectors including Adult Social Care, Landscaping and Construction. One of our trainees even won the Nationwide EFL Trust Trainee of the year.

This mixture of in-classroom learning, and work experience placements helps to prepare students with important skills to support their journey towards employment/training/further education.

We are also extremely excited to have been nominated in this years Golden Apple Awards 2022.

Any mention of 'connection' and 'Crewe' in the same breath would usually involve train journeys. Until the gradual development of motorways, the railway was the preferred mode of transport for a football team travelling any distance to

an away game.

That was certainly the case for Crewe Alexandra in 1960 ↓. After achieving a creditable draw against First Division side, Tottenham Hotspur, in a fourth round FA Cup tie at Gresty Road, they had to travel to London for the midweek replay on 3 February.

Legend has it that their train left from platform 2 at Crewe Station and when it arrived at Euston, the players found they had alighted on platform 13. As expected, the mighty Spurs won the game and 12 months later would be on their way to the first league and cup double of the 'modern' era. However, the score that February evening was amazing - indeed spooky in the circumstances - Spurs 13 Crewe 2.

I've seen a few Crewe games over the years but I'd like to indulge myself by sharing my memories of United's February 2008 League One match at Crewe. My wife and I were enjoying a couple of weeks in the south of Spain and our hotel had free internet that actually worked, so that was my easiest way of getting football news and results. However, the game on Saturday 16th was called off after heavy rain and rescheduled for Tuesday 26th.

This worked in my favour, as our return journey had been planned to include a few days in Carlisle, with the Doncaster game on the Saturday (which the Blues won 1-0 to retain fourth place).

So, while my wife went home to Scotland with our luggage, I went to Crewe with son, Ewan and our good friend, Brian Bassett. Before the game I met Crewe's legendary club historian, Harold Finch, who, just short of his 90th birthday, was still running the club's programme shop.

Harold kindly arranged an impromptu ground tour for us and we ended up in the hospitality area where a shy teenage girl stood with a bundle of Go£den Gamb£e tickets. Ewan and Brian, who of course organised the Brunton Park Golden Gamble, took all her tickets, sold most of them to the United directors and sponsors and we took the last 15 ourselves.

After the goalless first half I went behind the stand to phone my wife to check that she was home safe and spotted Ewan waving frantically at me. I had won the half time draw! Scott Dobie netted a second half winner and I went off happily to collect my cash - £130.

Having given Harold a tenner and split the rest three ways, as per our usual arrangement - except that was the only time we ever won anything - I had the princely sum of £40 as my winnings.

The programme had a player interview with Crewe and former Carlisle 'keeper, Ben Williams, and, by chance, we met him in the car park after the game to round off a very enjoyable evening.


