FROM THE CHAIRMAN

ANDREW JENKINS

A warm Brunton Park welcome to the directors, staff and players from Grimsby Town as they join us today.

Obviously it was interesting at the start of the season when we went to Blundell Park to be met by torrential rain, which seemed to be local to that area. The pitch became unplayable not long after the game kicked off and I don't think it came as a surprise to anyone when the referee signalled that he was abandoning the game.

All of that seems like a long time ago, with a lot of football played and a lot of twists and turns already seen since that day. With 13 games left to go I'm sure there will be a lot more of that to come for every team in the division.

We, of course, find ourselves in a very good position thanks to the hard work done by Paul, his staff and players. That includes the work on recruitment which has seen Paul, along with Greg and the other coaches, put together a group of players who have bought into the club and who are doing everything they can to make it an enjoyable end to the season for us.

Having scored five against Barrow recently it was good to see the same again at Crawley last weekend, where the players were ruthless in their approach to the game from the first minute. It was interesting to hear the manager speak afterwards about the fact that he was disappointed that more goals hadn't been scored. The players themselves commented that they were unhappy that they'd conceded two goals, and that they also felt they could have made it six or seven had they taken the other opportunities created.

This shows the standards that are being set, not just by the coaching staff, but by the dressing room and the very strong characters that are in there. The work done over the first 33 games has given them all an



opportunity, and the focus is now on continuing that through the games that remain.

I must mention the young fans who gave up their half-term to come along and spruce up the Warwick by painting barriers and some of the standing areas in that part of the ground. Sonny Kirkwood and his friends showed a fantastic attitude, and they rightly received a lot of plaudits for their efforts.

They are a shining example to others, and I hope we continue to see the Warwick Road End blossom, as the supporters who have started to go there have helped to create some superb noise and a great atmosphere.

I ask again for everyone to keep away from using pyrotechnics, throwing missiles and objects and taking part in chants and shouts that put the club in a bad light, and which can lead to fines and sanctions, as well as bans and possible action from the authorities for those responsible.

Let's help Sonny and the rest of the Warwick Road End group to build on the positivity they have become a very big part of creating by staying away from that type of thing.





United were in Cleethorpes for the second time in the space of a month for their rearranged League Two fixture, with the first attempt having fallen foul of some heavy rain and a 34th minute abandonment.

Carlisle started well with Stretton in a good position on the left flank. He dropped a shoulder and stepped inside, and he calmly rolled it for Moxon to hit. The midfielder became the latest player to register his first goal for the club with a thunderbolt of a 23-yard thump.

United went on the break again after Mellish had slid in to stop a shot, with the crowd screaming for a free kick. The visitors ignored that, and Stretton was sent on a sprint. He used pace to cover the distance, leaving the chasers in his wake, but Crocombe dived to make a two-handed save when the clipped shot came.

Manager Paul Simpson switched to a back four, with Mellish pushed into midfield, as he looked to stifle the threat of a build in home momentum, and it was a tactic that worked, with the Holy nets largely protected.

And it was an overload from the red shirts that nearly paid dividend as Dennis and Gibson used Moxon to edge their way forward. Armer came late in support, and Crocombe had to stretch to fingertip it away from the lurking Kris Dennis.

The corner from Moxon went low to the front stick, and a touch on the lean from Huntington left the defence

flat-footed. Mellish tried to control and shoot but he was judged to have handled as it came his way.

The lead was doubled on the stroke of half-time when Efete lost his bearings as he tried to get a pass back to Crocombe. Kris Dennis was on his toes and he netted his eighth of the season (his tenth for the club in total) as he touched the gift past the keeper before stroking it over the line.

Carlisle worked hard to keep things tight after the break, and it wasn't until the 55th minute that the Mariners had half a sight. Khan spun his marker and volleyed, but it sailed over the bar.

Grimsby threw more men forward, but a poor set piece delivery let some of the pressure out of the valve. But the hosts were right back in it when an initial clearance from a dipping corner left Khan with time. He wasn't closed down, and Michee Efete was able to make amends for his error as he bundled the ball over the line when it rumbled onto his boot.

The lively Richardson forged a run to the edge of the box moments later and he was tripped by Guy on the line of the 'D'. Khan took it on, but it was stopped the wall. A second foul by Armer, this time on the byline, gave Khan the chance to loft it in but Huntington leaped to nod it to safety.

Intelligent game management came into play as the home team found themselves at arm's length, and it was the 144 away contingent who celebrated as they watched their team see their first away win of the season to a successful conclusion.

We'd like to introduce ourselves. We are Level Playing Field, the leading charity in England and Wales campaigning and advocating on behalf of disabled sports fans.

Today, your club is using this match day to participate in our new national campaign, 'Unite For Access'. A celebration of disabled fans, accessibility, and inclusion at sports venues.

Did you know that an estimated 22% of the UK population are disabled?

That means it's very likely that you know someone who is disabled, or you might be reading this as someone who is disabled yourself.

Quick question - how did you get to the game today? If you came by train, did you know that 40% of railway stations don't have step-free access? Meaning that if you're a wheelchair user or ambulant disabled, even getting to a match can be a considerable barrier to attending this game.

Talking of barriers, Level Playing Field conducted a survey last year which found that nearly 29% of disabled fans considered the 'Attitudes of others' to be a barrier when attending live sports.

We appreciate that talking about disability can be daunting sometimes, it's a complex subject matter. That's why we invite all supporters, disabled and non-disabled, to engage with your club, Disabled Supporters Association (DSA) if it has one, and ourselves, because it's not just down to disabled people to highlight the importance of access and inclusion at your club...

The Mariners come to Brunton Park this afternoon for the first time in a couple of years so I'll start with a few away team connections.

Their Football League history has much in common with that of The Blues, though it started much earlier, on 3 September 1892. As founder members of Division 2, they beat Northwich Victoria 2-1 at Blundell Park which is actually in the neighbouring town, Cleethorpes, where they had moved 3 years earlier.

While Carlisle had only one season in the First Division, Grimsby enjoyed eleven, spread over 3 spells. They also have the unique distinction of having played in all five divisions. Failing re-election to Division 2 in 1920, they were given the chance to join the newly formed Third Division along with 21 teams from the Southern League! They transferred to Division 3 North when it started the next season. Promoted back to Division 2 in 1926, Grimsby started a long spell in the top two tiers and didn't play Carlisle in the League until we met in Div3N in 1951.



Bill By coincidence Shankly had just taken over as Grimsby manager after his two years in charge of Carlisle. Although there were no trophies to show for his tenure at Brunton Park, the charismatic Mr Shankly modernised the club in many ways, making it an important part of the community. Home crowds averaged nearly

12,000 and, for his visit with his Grimsby team, 14114 turned up. They saw Grimsby's Fred Marlow score possibly the fastest ever Brunton Park goal after10 seconds, his team eventually winning 2-1.

Our two clubs met for the first time on 1st February 1908 for an FA Cup second round tie at Blundell Park, Grimsby winning 6-2. We waited 100 years for a return clash but the Mariners won that too. 1-0 after a 1-1 draw here.

In their heyday they twice reached

the semi-final stage, losing to Arsenal in 1936 and Wolves in 1939. This season, a fine run including an impressive win against Championship side Luton has taken them at least to Round 5 when they travelled to Southampton on Wednesday evening.#

Grimsby won the FL Trophy once when they beat Bournemouth in 1998, Carlisle enjoying the first of two wins the previous year. The Mariners were out of the EFL from 2010 to 2016, returning via the play-

We met in League Two for the next five seasons and I remember a miserable Tuesday evening in October 2018 when, along with 3,315 others, I saw 23rd placed Grimsby win with Luke Hendrie's 36th minute goal.

My weekend visit had started with United losing 1-0 to Stevenage here on the previous Saturday, so I saw us drop from fifth to thirteenth. United finished the season in 11th place, while the Mariners steadied the ship to comfortably avoid relegation in 17th place.

Grimsby were relegated to the National League in 2021 but bounced straight back in dramatic fashion. Finishing sixth they navigated their way through the play-offs, winning 3-1 at Notts County, 5-4 at Wrexham and 2-1 v Solihull Moors. They conceded the first goal each time and all three ties went to extra time.

Here's hoping for an exciting, entertaining encounter today. Come on you Blues!


