### FROM THE CHAIRMAN

### FROM THE MANAGER

Good afternoon and welcome to our game against Stevenage. I also welcome Steve, his staff, and players to Brunton Park today.

The league table shows two teams who have earned the right to be where they are at this stage of the season, and I have no doubt that this will be a tough game between sides that want to end the season on a high.

As I've said a number of times, this stage of the season is about finding a way, and that was certainly what happened at Swindon last weekend. Credit to the players because they stuck to their tasks, and the reward was the manner in which we got the winning goal.

It was made better, of course, because both the fantastic finish from Jack and the header from Ryan were right in front of the travelling support. We're not going to get it all our own way. Within the 90 minutes of games we're going to have spells where we'll have to do the ugly stuff, but it's in our hands. The 35 games gone have shown us that we have earned the right to be in the top three, but that has to remain the case in the 11 still to play.

The response to the ticket offer for the Tranmere game has been fantastic, and I can only repeat that we want our supporters to continue to turn out in numbers for all of the remaining home games. It makes a huge difference when the crowd is behind the players and roaring them on, as we have seen so many times already this season.





### United rounded off 2021/22 at Brunton Park with a home game against Stevenage.

United hit the bar with just 90 seconds on the clock as Ellis hooked a clearance from a Gibson free kick back into the

mix. Patrick controlled, with his back to goal, and Gibson was there to go on the overlap. His delivery curled over Pym and the keeper was relieved to see it graze the woodwork and skitter away.

There was a scare for the home defence when Norris somehow bundled an awkwardly bouncing ball past Mellish and Armer, leaving just Howard to beat. He completely miskicked as he tried to finish it off and the stopper was able to gather it up.

There were a series of half-chances in what was a scrappy lead-up to the break, with United going closest when Gibson popped the ball into the box from deep. It whisked over a jump from Dennis and ripped just past the upright.

It was Riley who provided a spark on 53 minutes when he was there to snaffle up a clearance from a Dickenson cross. He beat his man, then unleashed a stunner from distance to register his third goal of the season.

Stevenage looked for an immediate response and they turned possession over to put Upson almost clean through. He took a touch and dropped a shoulder, but Howard had closed the angles and that allowed him to make a much needed save.

The home lead was doubled just past the hour when Armer came up in support of Dickenson, with the away defence pulled out of shape. His low delivery was expertly measured, and Lewis Alessandra was there to slide it into the net after Patrick had also stretched to get a touch.

Stevenage looked out of it, with the more incisive stuff coming from the men in blue, but Prosser got on the end of a wicked free kick, only to see his goal bound header hit Carter and spoon high into the air.

Carter then nodded wide when Wildin picked him out, and Dennis bent one over at the other end with the game steadily ticking along.

The visitors were awarded a penalty when there was a grapple between Cuthbert and Whelan – which took everybody by surprise – and Norris rammed the spot kick into the back of the net to give his side a chance.

Teenager Jack Ellis left the field to a standing ovation having completed an excellent debut, and Omotoye was prevented from restoring the cushion when he was quickly closed down at the end of the game.

Good afternoon everyone, my name is Paul Carrigan and I work for the Carlisle United Community Sports Trust (CUFC CST) as a Community Coach.

The role involves me supporting the trust in the delivery of various programmes supporting a wide range of people within Carlisle and the surrounding areas. This could be delivery of school education work including Literacy, Numeracy and PE; helping with our wide range of school holiday football camps; Little Foxes and Junior Foxes football coaching and working in schools delivering some Premier League Primary Stars (PLPS) projects.

#### LAST WEEK LOOKED LIKE:

Monday – Hayton School, delivering two PE lessons concentrating on Athletics to Yrs 4/5/6 and this week our focus was "jumping" so we examined the practices of how we might jump high or how we might jump long.

Tuesday - PLPS delivery at Langwathby School where alongside our PE lesson on invasion games Yr 5/6 are looking at "community cohesion" and how the schools community can really embrace and enhance their village community by providing some closer school/village links.

Thursday – Kingmoor Junior school invokes reading with yr 6; Lunch Time Sports Clubs, two PE lessons with Yr 4 and Yr 6 looking at how our bodies react to exercise, finishing with a Football After School Club for Yr 5/6.

Friday - Great Orton Primary where I deliver PE to the whole school, one lesson to pupils in KS1 and one lesson to pupils in KS2 both concentrated on throwing and catching.



As well as working for the Community Sports Trust I coach in the Carlisle United Academy with our under 10s; this week we are preparing for a fixture against Preston North End at Frenchfields, Penrith on Sunday morning.

My connection today is commentators, prompted by the passing last month of one of that profession's most accomplished exponents, John Motson +. More memories of Motty in a moment, but first a nod to some earlier commentators.

Raymond Glendenning and Kenneth Wolstenholme spring to mind from the 1950s and 60s. Later Brian Moore set the standard with ITV's 'The Big Match'. Carlisle featuring a few times in our 70s' heyday.

Some of these games on waterlogged or snowcovered pitches would surely be postponed these days. Brian was also a Gillingham FC chairman, while Jimmy Hill who worked in turn for ITV, BBC and Sky, had been PFA Chairman and Coventry City chairman. Jimmy was unpopular in Scotland after describing David Narey's 1982 World Cup goal against Brazil as a 'toe poke' and making other dismissive comments. The offensive chant which regularly greeted him at Scotland matches eventually changed to 'We love Jimmy Hill, he's a Scot'.

Local radio also produced personalities like our own, much-loved Derek Lacey, taken from us too young in 2009 after more than 500 commentaries on Blues' games for BBC Radio Cumbria. It's no exaggeration to say that Derek has been immortalised by his enthusiastic description of that amazing Jimmy Glass moment in May 1999.

John Motson's voice became familiar to listeners and viewers of the BBC and by the time he retired in 2018, he was recognised as 'the voice of English football'. His thorough research and preparation to have lots of interesting stats and instantly recognise the players became legendary. Inevitably circumstances sometimes worked against him, like when co-commentator Mark Lawrenson knocked over a bottle of water across Motty's notes during the European Nations Final. On 9th February 1985, John was on his way to Anfield for Liverpool v Arsenal when the game was called off and instead BBC sent him to Manchester City v Carlisle. He knew our manager, Bob Stokoe, but not the players and Mr Stokoe took him into the dressing-room and introduced them all individually. Success all round flawless commentary and a 3-1 win for Carlisle.

Motty always readily acknowledged that his lucky break came in February 1972 when he had probably 'drawn the short straw' by being sent to commentate on the delayed Hereford United v Newcastle United FA Cup replay for Match of the Day round-up. Ronnie Radford and Ricky George, who became a lifelong friend, scored the goals as the non-league side beat the North East giants 2-1.

Film of that goal with Motty's description became one of the top FA Cup TV moments. Standing on draughty TV gantries, Motson realised that he needed really warm clothing and his sheepskin coat became famous after he appeared in a snowstorm at Wycombe's Adams Park to announce the postponement of the cup tie v Peterborough. One his coats is displayed in the National Football Museum at Manchester.

I was never lucky enough to meet Motty. He had performed the official opening of a pub near his home, and I spent a night there - in the hotel not the pub - en route to a Carlisle away game in 2017. I enjoyed a pint, but my commentator hero didn't look in that Friday night.
