FROM THE MANAGER

PAUL SIMPSON

Good afternoon and welcome to our Saturday afternoon home game against Swindon Town. I welcome Scott, his staff and players to Brunton Park today for what I am sure will be a good game of football.

Our opening two league games brought us a lot to be pleased about, and areas where we know we can improve – that’s always going to be the case at the start of a new season.

The important thing from both fixtures was that the players have shown us that they can take messages on board, and work hard to implement them out on the pitch. They’ve also demonstrated that their fitness and stamina levels are in a good place at this early important stage.

As we saw at Colchester, we aren’t going to get everything our own way, and it comes down to how we react to different situations within games that will determine the outcome of our season. The group is demanding from each other in training, and on match days, and that bodes well.

The heat and conditions made that a different kind of challenge, with a very dry surface that made getting the ball down and moving it quickly slightly more difficult, and we went into that one off the back of a long Friday journey.

On chances created we felt we deserved to be at least level going into the break, and it was a different kind of performance that was needed going into the second half. As we’ve said to the players all along,

if they go out there and give it everything, as they have done so far, the fans will respond.

The level of support we get home and away isn’t taken lightly, and we constantly remind ourselves that we have to play our part to make sure it continues. It makes a huge difference to the players to see and hear it when they come out of the tunnel, and all we can do is say thank you for the way you’re getting behind us.

We saw that again on Tuesday night when fantastic numbers made their way to Shrewsbury. That was another game where we saw a team performance and, as I keep saying, if we continue to get good levels on a consistent basis then positive results will come off that.

It was another night where we created good chances, had spells of domination and some good passages of play, and we also had some strange decisions to deal with. However, that’s gone now. As ever we learn from it, move on, and focus on the important league games to come, starting with this one here today.

The squad endured a nightmare Friday journey to get to Swindon, due to a serious road traffic accident on the M6, with road closures and diversions the order of the day almost every step of the way.

But it was United who came out of the traps quickest and midfielder **Joe Riley** † marked appearance number 50 for the club in some style on 13 minutes when he sat deep as the Blues once more peppered the box. It came his way, some 23-yards out, and he steadied himself before netting the goal the good start had warranted with a beautifully struck finish.

The Robins were back on terms from their first meaningful attack of the game on 30 minutes when a free kick from 40-yards out was sent deep.

It was nodded back across the face of goal by Gladwin and Crichlow tapped it in from close range as he sprinted to get a touch.

The Cumbrians restored their lead on 43 minutes when a huge throw from Riley from just beside the corner flag was flicked on by McDonald. The alert Jon Mellish had the first stab, but Wollacott pulled off an excellent point-blank save. That paved the way for Tristan Abrahams to open his account as he stabbed the rebound over the line.

United almost carved their way through on the hour when Tanner overlapped on the right. His clipped cross was near perfect, but the keeper did just enough to get his hands to it before Abrahams could pounce.

The tempo ticked over and a run from Alessandra saw him protect possession before the late arriving Jack Armer took over. His cross turned into a shot as it rifled towards Wollacott.

United had to defend through the closing five minutes and there was a heart in the mouth moment when Kesler-Hayden was sent one-on-one with Norman. The stopper spread himself, and he got enough on it to take it past the post.

Kesler-Hayden was shown his second yellow with seven minutes of time added having been played when he cut Mampala down. That was the last action of the day and the visitors collected a deserved three points.

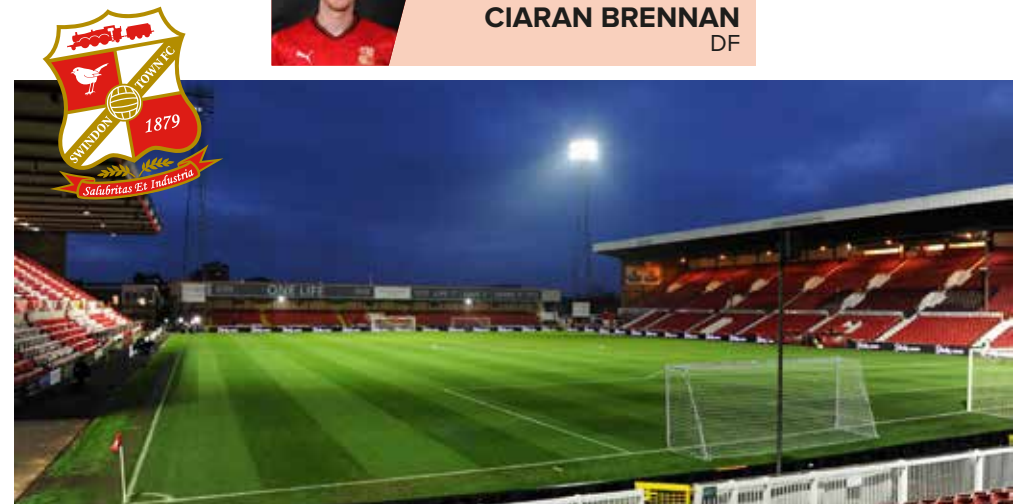

ENGLISH FOOTBALL LEAGUE - LEAGUE TWO SPOTLIGHT

After ending last season on a 13-game league run without a clean sheet, AFC Wimbledon have kept a clean sheet in each of their two League Two matches this season.

Two of the three players to complete the most passes in League Two so far this season have been Bradford City players: Romoney Crichlow (150, 1st) and Matthew Platt (137, 3rd).

My theme today is 1970, Mexico World Cup year and the first image that springs to mind is the 'wonder save' by England keeper Gordon Banks † who somehow scooped a point-blank downward header from Pele over his bar.

Brazil won 1-0 with a goal from Jair but England came through the group, thanks to 1-0 wins over Romania and Czechoslovakia. Banks missed the quarter-final match against West Germany with a stomach illness and his deputy Peter Bonetti came in for criticism as England surrendered a 2-0 lead to lose 3-2 after extra time. Brazil went on to lift the Jules Rimet trophy after a 4-1 final win against Italy.

In March 1969 Third Division Swindon Town had beaten Arsenal 3-1 at Wembley to lift the League Cup and had also won promotion to the Second Division. 17,373 fans watched the first 69/70 home game at the County Ground – a 2-2 draw with Carlisle United. 9,723 were at Brunton Park for the return game which also ended 2-2.

United also enjoyed their best League Cup run before losing 4-2 on aggregate to West Bromwich Albion in the semi-final.



Swindon finished fifth just three points short of winning promotion to the top league, while United came twelfth. In 70/71 United won 2-1 here and drew 0-0 at Swindon and came fourth, three points behind promoted Sheffield United.

For Carlisle's players and fans 1970 started with a visit to Nottingham Forest for the FA Cup tie on Saturday 4 January and a very creditable goalless draw on a frozen, snow covered pitch against the highly rated First Division team.

On the following Tuesday evening goals from Tommy Murray and George McVitie gave United a 2-1 replay win. After beating Aldershot, again after a replay, United welcomed Middlesbrough to Brunton Park.

There was no fairy tale ending for the record crowd of 27,500 and viewers of Border TV's live coverage – Middlesbrough, with Hughie McIlmoyle, won 2-1, their first ever win here. Ironically United had already done a league double over 'Boro.

I lived in Glasgow, near Hampden Park, so most of my 1970 memories are of games in or near the city. On March 14 I was at Perth, where Aberdeen beat Kilmarnock 1-0 in the Scottish Cup semi-final on St Johnstone's Muirton Park.

I took my dad to see a Celtic v Aberdeen midweek game which the Dons won 2-1 to delay Celtic's league title celebrations. In April I was at Hampden alongside 30,000 other Dons fans as Aberdeen beat Celtic 3-1 to lift the Scottish Cup.

Celtic did win the Scottish League and also beat Leeds over the two legs of the European Cup semi but lost the final 2-1 to Feyenoord.

I was also in the 137,000 crowd when Scotland drew 0-0 with England and I am convinced that my ticket, gifted by a friend in the Metropolitan Police, was one of the 3,000 forgeries, detected after the game.

A new job took me up to Wick in August 1970 so I swapped Hampden Park for Harmsworth Park and now, 52 years and several hundred football matches later, that's where I'll be today for Wick Academy's Highland League game with Turriff United.
