## **Ongoing projects**

**Wellbeing Through Football** – The Project has become 'Show & Tell' and we are working with Cumberland Council project continues. The first event of the Show and Tell project will take place on 17<sup>th</sup> December at Petteril Bank Community Centre from 1-4pm

As mentioned at the last meeting we recently held games featuring Hilltop United FC. Unfortunately, due to Home Office policy, the two full teams that were Hilltop United FC have been decimated and now amount to 14 players, as many have been moved on away from Carlisle due to the imminent closure of the Hilltop Hotel as an Asylum Seeker/Refugee hotel. Some of the players have been moved into houses within the city and will continue to play for the team. The same is happening at the Cumbria Park Hotel which has been housing the women. CRAG and others are doing their best to keep as many in Carlisle as possible, but unfortunately there is NO housing set aside for women asylum seekers/refugees in the city. This is such a shame because the integration that both the men and women have made into Carlisle society has been amazing. We hope that they are able to stay in the city and continue to support CUFC EDI and vice versa.

**Neurodiversity** – This project is ongoing, and EDI recently did some training for approx. 20 EFL clubs as part of the EFL's Together Strategy training modules. This was well received and prompted many questions. The plan is now to take this further in the community – more to follow...

Jon's audit report has now been received and we are looking to implement his suggestions. The major takeaway from this report was the requirement for 'Audio Descriptive Commentary' which is something we would like to implement at the ground.



**Home game 11<sup>th</sup> November** - Celebrated Remembrance Sunday and we had our second 'Walk to the Match' ahead of kick off, led by Carlisle supporter Craig Milne. We also laid a wreath at the cenotaph in Rickerby Park on the way to the ground.



Home game 25<sup>th</sup> November – We recognised 'Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women' and 'White Ribbon Day'. We held a really successful seminar in the Study Centre. There were various speakers including Lee McDermott from the University of Cumbria, Lee Sherriff from 'Behind the Mask', Ros Jones, author of 'When I was a Girl', Det Inspector Matt Belshaw from Cumbria Police (VAWG Project), Joy Sayers from the Well Communities and Springfield Domestic Abuse Support. It was also the first day for the new majority shareholders to take their place in the ground and we were blessed with a visit from Tom and Patty Piatak with Nigel Clibbens.
